INFORMATION ABOUT BEYOĞLU DISTRICT

Beyoğlu, the cultural center of Istanbul with its' rich cultural heritage, creative industries, historical and cultural diversity, hosts since centuries people from different cultures living together in harmony. Beyoğlu is an open air museum with its' historical monuments and is the center of cultural centers. art galleries, cafes and restaurants.

 Beyoğlu is a district located on the European side of İstanbul, separated from the old city by the Golden Horn. The district encompasses other neighborhoods located north of the Golden Horn, including Galata, Tophane, Cihangir, Şişhane, Tepebaşı, Tarlabaşı, Dolapdere and Kasımpaşa, and is connected to the old city center across the Golden Horn through the Galata Bridge and Unkapanı Bridge. Beyoğlu is the most active art, entertainment and night life centre of Istanbul

• The population of the district is 250.000. Each day there are more than 1 million people passing by the street of Istiklal.

 The main street of Beyoğlu, İstiklâl Caddesi, from Taksim Square, a pedestrian street where shops, cafés, patisseries, restaurants, pubs, wine houses and clubs, as well as bookshops, theatres, cinemas and art galleries are located. Some parts of İstiklâl has a 19th century metropolitan character, and the avenue is lined with Neoclassical and Art Nouveau buildings. The nostalgic tram which runs on Istiklal Avenue, between Taksim Square and Tünel, was also re-installed in the early 1990s with the aim of reviving the historic atmosphere

• A large number of the cultural creative industries are located in Beyoğlu, such to give you very few; Emek Theatre, Istanbul Modern Museum, Pera Museum, Koç Museum, Doğançay Museum, TURVAK, SALT, Arter and the majority of the cultural centers and galleries.

After gaining experience in various fields of tourism, he became general manager in a private company in the tourism sector.

Mr. Daniel Tudorache Mayor of Bucharest Sector 1

Date of Birth 27.02.1964, Mr. Daniel Tudorache graduated from the Polytechnic Institute of Bucharest in 1988, with a degree in Engineering of Transport Technology and Remote Railways. He was elected the Mayor of District 1 in 2016, being at his first mandate of this administrative area. Mr. Daniel Tudorache also served as Deputy Mayor of District 1 during 2008-2011. At the same time, he obtained a deputy mandate in the Parliament of Romania between 2012- 2016.

The main projects for his mandate are as follows:

- Thermal rehabilitation of the apartment buildings, free of charge for its citizens
- Energy efficiency program for the houses, free of charge for its citizens
- Implementation of an integrated waste management system with investments in selective collection, sorting and waste treatment

Built over a large plain, the Çivril district, which dates back to as early as 3000 BC is where the Battle of Miryokefalon which opened the gate of Anadolu for Turks was won. The district which was home to many civilizations was rescued from foreign occupation on August 30, 1922. Isikli Lake, Gökgöl, Akdağ Nature Park, Tokalı Canyon and Gümüşsu waterfall are some of the many touristic attractions Çivril has to offer as well as wide rich fertile farming areas and a huge ecotourism potential.

Together with Pamukkale, Karahayit, Kaklık Cave and Lavanta Fragrance Village, it offers a triangle with myriad of touristic attractions for nature lovers; enthusiasts of photography, cycling, trekking, photo safari at dusk and under the moonlight, mountaineering, climbing, camping and caravan tourism, highland tourism, wildlife observation, cultural tourism (Eumenia Antique City, Sülemaynlı Beyce Sultan Tumulus and Shrine, Sırbensah Mosque, Beykoy Mosque, Duzbel Miryokefalon battle field, etc.) This area which has a rich flora (is home to lotus flower and endemic plant species such as Polygonum convolvulus and polygonum afyonicum) and fauna (the only endemic bird species of Anatolia; Krüper`s Nuthatch, Red Vulture, Black Vulture, White-tailed Eagle, Golden Eagle and Lesser Kestrel and horses); It is one of the most important wetlands of Turkey. It is designated a wetland of international importance under the Ramsar Convention.

Işıklı and Gökgöl lakes are home to 33 invertebrate, 10 inland water fish; 5 amphibia; 14 reptilian, 109 class aves and 14 mammalian species. Each year, the first week of September is the traditional Apple Farming and Culture Festival where we promote Apples, Peaches and Sunflower seeds grown in our district.

Çivril which has a population of 60.000 people offers a blend of history and natural beauties in this unique geography.

Mayor of Evren

He was born in Evren, Ankara on 17/08/1967. After completing his primary and secondary education in Evren and finishing high school in Ankara, Demirci studied at the International Business Department of Anglia Ruskin University.

He worked in the trade sector between the years 1986-2005. His political life began in his district in 1994. Between the years 2001-2009, he successfully carried out his duty as the founder of Evren District Presidency of the Justice and Development Party (AKP). Resigning from his position as the district president of his party, he became a mayor candidate in the local elections in 2013.

Besides various non-governmental organizations, he also worked in our district as the President of the Courses and Aid Association for Students. Demirci was elected in 2009 local elections, and became the person with most success to have been elected into the Mayorship of Evren throughout its history.

Now married and father of three, Demirci's favorite hobbies are playing football and photography.



Evren, one of Ankara's remotest districts, is a settlement located at the banks of Hirfanlı dam with a population of 5000. The old settlement known as Çıkınağıl was enundated with the waters of Hirfanlı dam in 1957 and was relocated to its present planned and zoned place in 1958 and got the status of municipality as part of Sereflikochisar district in 1968 and was renamed EVREN in 1982.

Our district is home to two tumuli; one one of them is located two kilometers outside our district, in the Semizbağı region and is 25-30 meters in height and 80-100 meters in width, while the other one is about the same dimensions inside the lake in the Solakusagi region. There is also an Armenian cemetery in Ilgıyer, Sığırcık Castle in Çatalpınar village and Toplu Castle beside Eski Torunobası village. There is also a castle named Sarnıçlı Kızlar Castle located between the Çatalpınar and Solakuşağı villages which belongs to the Byzantine period.

These remains which belong to the Byzantine and Ottoman eras show that this site is an ancient settlement area. Evren is one of the many settlements in our country which are not mentioned much in historic records. Of course, Evren's history cannot be thought separately from that of Şereflikoçhisar. One can find brief information about Evren in historical records about Şereflikoçhisar. However, it seemed there was need for more detailed information about Evren.

That's exactly what we tried to do. An examination of historical records reveal that Evren (Çıkınağıl) was inhabited by the Hittite, Assyrians, Romans, Persians, and Friggs throughout history and was later dominated by Seljuk and Ottoman Empires. Although there are no written records, it is believed that Evren (Çıkınağıl) was opened to the Muslim Turkish settlement under the Ottoman rule in 1500s during the reign of Sultan Beyazıt 2nd and has a history of approximately 514 years as of July 2014.

We found that the first settlers of the region had been Circassians of Caucasus origin and in the following years those who escaped the Russian occupation in Eastern Anatolia settled here.





Mr. Abu Snenieh Mayor of Hebron

Mr. Tayseer Abu Snenieh was born in Hebron on October 1954, and finished his high school in it. He finished his Bachelor degree in Mathematics and religious studies from Jordan University. He worked as mathematics teacher in Hebron Schools.

Then he worked in the Ministry of waqf and was appointed as the general manager of the general administration. Afterwards, he was assigned as the general manager of the waqf directorate in Hebron.

Mr. Abu Snenieh was elected as the Hebron Mayor in the elections which took place

in May 2017 and had been acting as the Mayor since then.



Hebron is known as the city of the patriarchs and famous for its historical tie to the Prophet Abraham. Situated in the heartland of Palestine, encircled by mountains as high as 1000 meters above sea level, Hebron has a moderate climate throughout the year. The city has a deep heritage that can be traced back to the Canaanites, who settled here over 6,000 years ago due to the fertility of the earth from whose bounty they prospered.

Due to its importance and strategic location, the city has suffered throughout history from many wars at the hands of the greedy invaders. The latest war has been with the Israeli occupier, who occupied the city in the last third of the twentieth century. It has implanted settlements within the Old city and coerced the division of Al-Ibrahimi Masque into two parts. Moreover the Israelis surrounded the city by a fence of settlements and the apartheid wall. It has been trying to eradicate its neighboring Arab-Islamic identity through many massacres, daily violations, tightening the siege and targeting the citizens and the environment of Hebron through violent measures.

Despite the ferocity of the Israeli operation, all the ambitions of the occupiers have been obliterated with the determination and tenacity of Hebron's citizens to persevere. The children are known for their love and playfulness despite living under Occupation and daily struggle. Citizens work in the city of Hebron and participate in the social, political and economic activities that the elected municipal council introduces. The council has set its mind to heal the wounds of the city and move towards further prosperity and progress of people's lives. The city is characterized by its tolerant Islamic religious belief, moral values and commercial importance.

Since 1996, the city has witnessed several dramatic developments after the numerous decades of continuous Israeli occupation. Due to the Oslo agreement and the establishment of the Palestinian National Authority, the city was liberated and able to embrace a form of security and calm environment. These agreements allowed the Municipal Council to develop a comprehensive management development plan, accompanied by a strategic plan, for the reception of the twenty-first century. Indeed, the Hebron Municipality office, through its own efforts and the support of many friends and partners from around the world implemented a multitude of infrastructure projects, which has had a major impact in promoting domestic and foreign investments in the city. Additionally, it is crucial to achieving the revitalization of the boom in the economic, commercial, industrial, agricultural and urban life.

La Marsa is a coastal town in far north eastern Tunisia near the capital Tunis. The population is estimated as 92,987, as of 2014. The old summer capital of pre-colonial Tunisia, it is today a popular vacation spot for many wealthy Tunisians. It is connected to Tunis by the TGM railway. Gammarth is adjacent to El Marsa further up the coast.

History

Ancient Carthage was a Semitic civilization centered on the Phoenician city-state of Carthage, located in North Africa on the Gulf of Tunis, outside what is now Tunis, Tunisia. It was founded in 814 BC. Originally a dependency of the Phoenician state of Tyre, Carthage gained independence around 650 BC and established a hegemony over other Phoenician settlements throughout the Mediterranean, North Africa and what is now Spain which lasted until the end of the 3rd century BC.

At the height of the city's prominence, its political influence extended over most of the western Mediterranean and it was one of the major trade hubs.

For much of its history, Carthage was in a constant state of struggle with the Greeks on Sicily and the Roman Republic, which led to a series of armed conflicts known as the Greek-Punic Wars and Punic Wars. They also had to deal with the volatile Berbers, the indigenous inhabitants of the entire area where Carthage was built. In 146 BC, after the third and final Punic War, Carthage was destroyed and then occupied by Roman forces. Nearly all of the other Phoenician city-states and former Carthaginian dependencies fell into Roman hands from then on.

Attractions

Abdalliya Palace is one of the most lavish creations Hafsid dynasty sultans. Built in the early sixteenth century by one of their last sovereign, Abu Abdallah Mohamed, this palace stands on the ancient port site of El Marsa. This place of remembrance and history is one of the few monuments Hafsid Tunisia. Al ABDELLYA is the oldest evidence of Muslim architecture Palatine remained in good state of conservation of the Maghreb. Cinema Alhambra is located in El Marsa

La Marsa houses the following French international schools: Lycée Gustave Flaubert - École Paul-Verlaine[1] They are a part of the Establishment Regional De La Marsa (ELRM) which has 7 schools in Tunisia as members

Mannheim is an international city, since its foundation in 1607, and it likes the intercultural exchange that comes from 170 nations living together in a city of 320,000 inhabitants. At the centre of the Palatine region and in the middle of the Metropolitan Region Rhine-Neckar, Mannheim is an important economic hub with an export ratio of 66% from businesses in Mannheim.

Being a university city with a number of higher education institutions, Mannheim both supports local talents and recruits international talents. This fits in with its strategy to support and develop the start-up sector, leading to an active and successful creative economy.

PÉCS with its population of app. 150 000, lies on 163 km2 in the South-western part of Hungary. The cultural, architectural and natural variety and its climate make the city attractive.

Pécs was always adapting to its surroundings and transformed several times: from a Celtic village to a Roman stronghold, from a medieval centre of Christianity into an Ottoman city, or from a baroque feudal city to a mining industry centre and finally into a sustainable, smart city.

Between 2011 and 2016, most of the public services (e.g. urban management tasks, Mobility Centre, waste management, cemetery and the social employment tasks) were united in the same city owned company, allowing better synergies during daily operation.

A wide variety of IT-based solutions are used in city planning and operation; from laser-scanner 3D modelling through real-time googlemap connected mobility apps to QR-code based nature trail in the forests.
