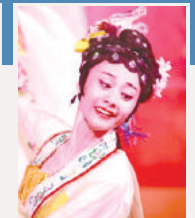

- Technical Tour of the top tourist attractions of Chengdu and Sichuan Province

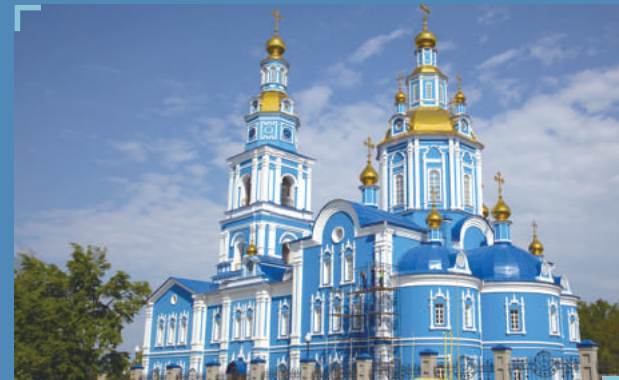


Host City of the 3rd WeGO General Assembly 2014: **Chengdu, Can Do!**

e-GOVERNMENT TRAINING PROGRAM IN SEOUL

This year, WeGO's annual one-week "Seoul Program" - a popular e-Government Training Program in partnership with the Seoul Human Resource Development Center (SHRDC) in Seoul, Korea- featured lectures and interactive sessions on smart e-Government, intelligent transportation systems, administrative reform and open innovation, as well as site visits to Seoul's state-of-the-art e-Government facilities and cultural excursions for 15 public officials of 8 WeGO member cities.

2014 was particularly noteworthy as the WeGO Regional Offices in Asia and Europe rolled out their own e-Government capacity building programs for the first time:

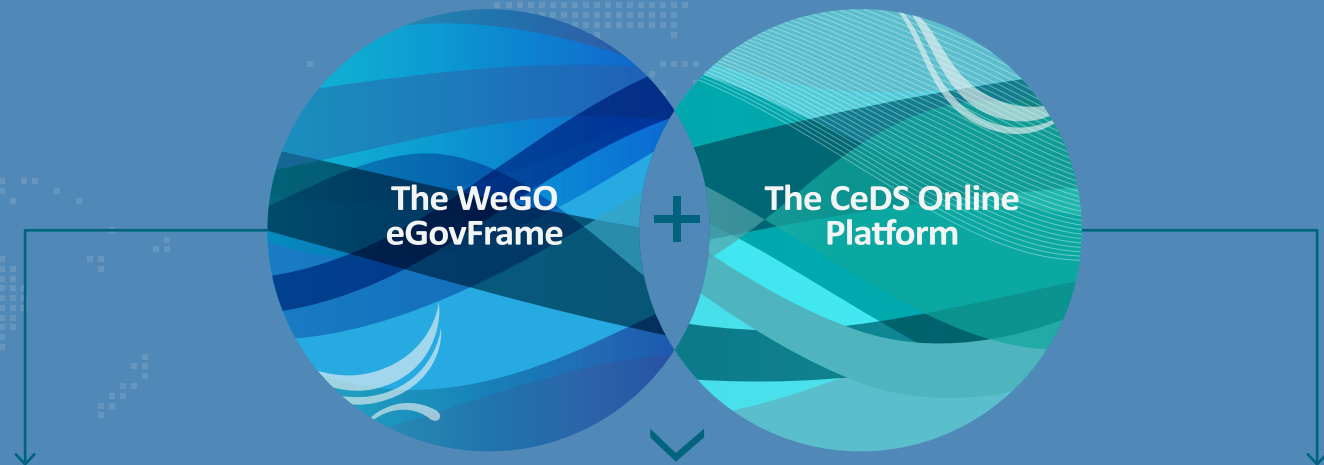

e-GOV TOOLS

WeGO continued to offer cost-efficient and easy-to-use e-Gov Tools to members in 2014.



Pursuant to a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between WeGO and the National Information Society Agency (NIA)- the core agency for providing technical policy advice in Korea- the WeGO eGovFrame became available to WeGO members in 2014. Initially developed by NIA as an ambitious USD 18 million multi-year project, the WeGO eGovFrame is a standardized and open source software framework that provides a general technical infrastructure and smart development tools, as well as hundreds of reusable common components, to enhance the efficiency and interoperability of e-Government systems of local governments and resolve their dependency on specific IT vendors.

WeGO and NIA will offer comprehensive support through training and technical assistance to WeGO members using the WeGO eGovFrame.

The City e-Government and Diagnostic Solution (CeDS) Toolkit was jointly developed by WeGO, the World Bank, Seoul Metropolitan Government, and IT consultants from 2012-2013 as the first of its kind toolkit focusing on the e-Government agenda of local, rather than national, governments. Originally based on an intricate Excel-spreadsheet, the CeDS was created to enable city officials with limited ICT knowledge to evaluate the status of their city's e-Government maturity level and conceptualize plans for the future development of their e-Government system without consulting outside experts.

In 2014, WeGO embarked on converting the original Excel-based CeDS into an online data platform with more sophisticated data analysis, easier-to-use features, and interactive elements. WeGO will unveil the CeDS Online Data Platform exclusively for WeGO members and partners in the first half of 2015.

As the largest local government organization in the world advocating democratic local self-government, UCLG is an important partner for WeGO. Later in the year, Dr. Bernadia Tjandradewi, Secretary General of UCLG ASPAC, participated in the 3rd WeGO General Assembly as a featured speaker.

The 4th Moscow Urban Forum

The Moscow Urban Forum is an annual international event held under the auspices of the Government of Moscow. This year, the 4th Moscow Urban Forum included a conference on the theme of "Government and Citizens: Technologies of Cooperation" for the first time, demonstrating the increasing relevance of technology's role in sustainable urban development. WeGO's Secretary General Dr. Kim shared Seoul's experience of transforming into a "best smart technology city" hand-in-hand with Seoul's citizens, with a focus on the city's upcoming Internet of Things (IoT) project in pilot city districts. A fruitful meeting with Moscow Deputy Mayor Anastasia Rakova at the Moscow Urban Forum is expected to lead to active collaboration with the City of Moscow in 2015.

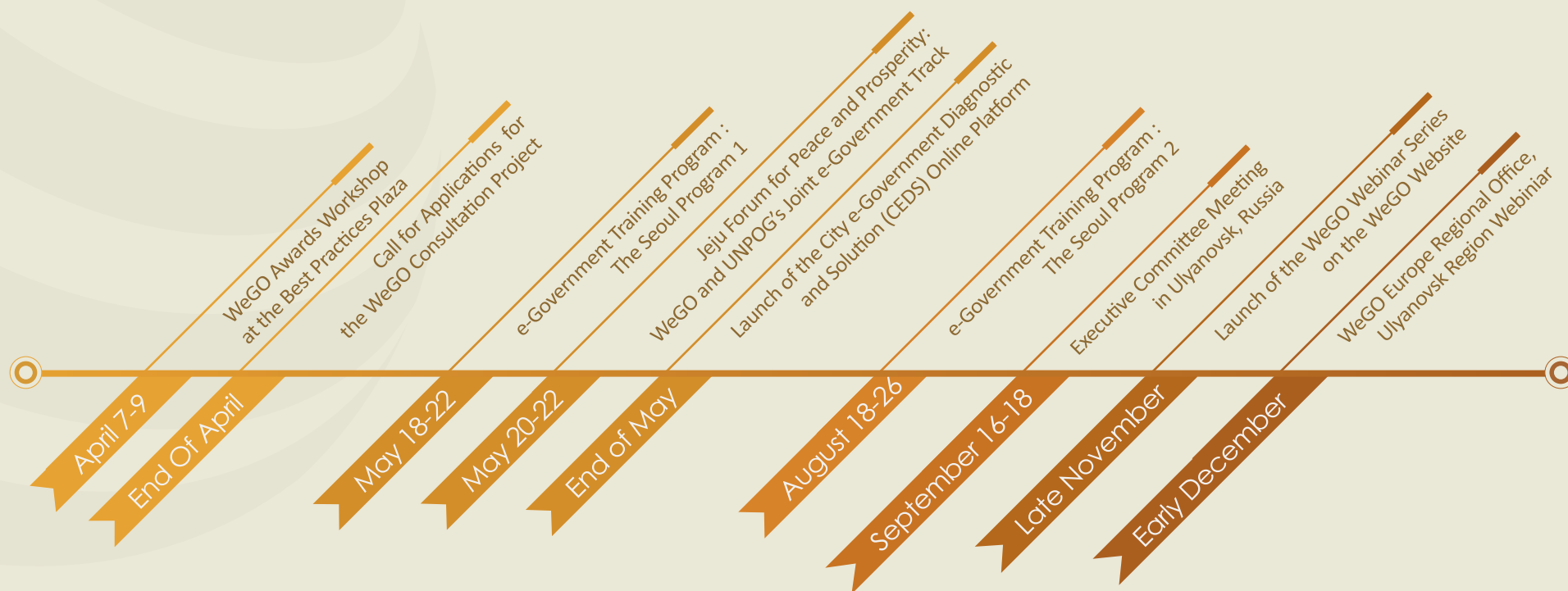

WeGO Awards Workshop at the Best Practices Plaza

April 7-9

The WeGO Secretariat will host a WeGO Awards Workshop at the Best Practices Plaza during the III Meeting of Municipalities with Sustainable Development in Brasilia, Brazil, which is organized by the National Front of Mayors in Brazil, to encourage good practice sharing among cities. At the Workshop, the WeGO Secretariat will introduce its popular WeGO Awards and past WeGO Awards winners, Seoul and San Fernando (La Union), will showcase their best e-Government practices. Over 500 Mayors and senior officials from local governments in Brazil are expected to attend the event.

Call for Applications for the WeGO Consultation Project
