

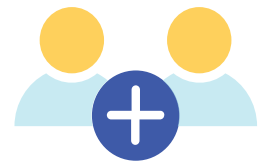

- To attend the GCTC Expo, please inform us and register [here](#). Cities are strongly encouraged to form project teams known as 'action clusters' as they can take advantage of exhibition and speaking opportunities.
- To register an action cluster, please complete and submit a project worksheet to [secretariat@we-gov.org](mailto:secretariat@we-gov.org), which will be reviewed and approved by the organizers. A template and sample are attached. The worksheet should demonstrate the progress of a project that has recently been or is being implemented by your local government, with additional focus on cybersecurity and privacy.

- A booth or tabletop space will be available free of charge (excluding utilities and internet) to action clusters as well as any organization that wants to exhibit their smart city and/or IoT solutions (prototypes, pilots, and/or preliminary results). # What is GCTC?

**Global City Teams Challenge (GCTC)** is a collaborative platform for the development of smart cities and communities, led by the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), a bureau of the U.S. Department of Commerce, co-hosted with U.S. Department of Homeland Security Science and Technology Directorate (DHS S&T). It enables local governments, non-profit organizations, academic institutions, technologists, and corporations from all over the world to form project teams, or “action clusters,” and “SuperClusters,” to work on groundbreaking Internet of Things (IoT) and Cyber-Physical Systems (CPS) applications within the city and community environment. The 2018–2019 round, called the Smart and Secure Cities and Communities Challenge (SC3), encourages participating teams to focus on cybersecurity and privacy in addition to replicability, scalability, and sustainability.

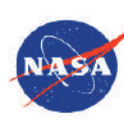
SuperClusters are alliances of action clusters and relevant additional stakeholders grouped into sectors. In total, there are seven of these, any of which new action clusters are welcome to join:

- Transportation
- Public Safety
- Utilities (Energy/Water/Waste)
- Wireless
- Data (Platform, Governance, Exchange)
- Agriculture/Rural Area
- Education
