

Africa Smart Cities Network Seminar | June 29, 2021 | Online

Summary of Outcomes and Recommendations

A. Background and Objectives of the Seminar

WeGO aims to take the initiative to establish its Africa Smart Cities Network (AFSCN) to provide a platform to facilitate conversations, collaboration, and cooperation in enabling the establishment of smart and sustainable cities, towns, and villages in Africa.

The Seminar held on June 29, 2021, and entitled "Strengthening Awareness of the Need for Transformational Leadership, Regional Cooperation, and Digital Skills for Smart and Sustainable Communities in Africa", was the first event related to the AFSCN initiative. WeGO gathered thought leaders in digital project implementation, capacity building, and regional cooperation to share their knowledge on unlocking Africa's development potential through smart cities.

The objectives of the Seminar were to:

- Present WeGO's Africa Smart Cities Network (AFSCN) initiative and secure support
- Share best practice and facilitate discussion on the successes and challenges in leadership, capacity, and cooperation in enabling smart cities in Africa
- Gather feedback from stakeholders on their requirements for the Network
- Hold discussions on developing smart city solutions and approaches for the African context

As a result of this Seminar, WeGO was able to:

- Share knowledge and best practice among key stakeholders and smart city practitioners
- Identify collaboration opportunities and set the direction for further cooperation and exchange on smart communities in Africa under the AFSCN
- Contribute to enhancing the awareness of the necessity of smart communities

C. Main Recommendations from Panel Discussion

THEME 1. LEADERSHIP

- Acknowledge that digital transformation requires a *revolution of the mindset* starting from the top
 - Transitioning to knowledge-based economies is where smart cities come into play transforming the human being into the main resource
- Raise awareness of the need to *bring science and technology into processes* to add value
- Institutionalize approaches that do not leave any citizen behind by adhering to the *principles of a just city*: dignity, equity, diversity, rights, responsibility, and democracy
- *Mainstream digital for leaders* at both the local and regional government levels, embedding it in their vision, mission, and activities

THEME 2. CAPACITY BUILDING

- Accelerate training of *research and development* expertise for local solutions to improve adoption
- Create a larger pool of *African experts* working in smart city solutions and technologies
- Enhance focus on *cybersecurity* in light of the increase of digital government services and associated digital transactions
- Invest in *ethics and the culture of public service* for citizens, communities, and businesses
- Build capacity in the policy design and implementation of the *digitization of public services*

THEME 3. PROJECT SUSTAINABILITY

- Formalize *participatory processes* in developing and implementing solutions to ensure sustainability
 - Solution providers should immerse themselves in the community to fully understand their challenges and needs
 - Citizens are key sources of unique data that can guide the development of appropriate and effective solutions
- Create solutions that respond to the *local context* to enhance the uptake of digital services and sustainability
 - Smart solutions for African cities, towns, and villages need to develop while remaining true to the local realities
 - Example: In Kigali, the number solution used in the fight against COVID-19 (450% increase in use) was digital payment services through mobile money

THEME 4. COOPERATION & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Build the right solutions by not only *involving all key stakeholders* such as political decisionmakers, beneficiaries, funding agencies, communication and evaluation bodies, etc., but also ensuring that each fully understands their roles, takes ownership in the co-design of projects, and is involved in the process from the beginning to the end
- *Identify and collaborate with existing local experts* to benefit from their experience in cocreation and reduce dependence on international technical support



- Ensure that *valid and up to date information is available and accessible* for citizens to be involved in the decision-making process from the identification of needs through implementation, monitoring, and evaluation
- Adapt and implement at the local government level *existing tools and methodologies* such as citizen budgeting, participatory budgeting, territorial coaching, etc.
- **Realize leave-no-one-behind** by including women, youth, people with disabilities, and marginalized populations
