This will be a meaningful gathering where members come together to collectively envision the future of “Smart Cities for All.” We will continue to advance initiatives to build a safer, more sustainable, and inclusive smart city ecosystem where no one is left behind.

We look forward to the continued cooperation of all members within the WeGO network as we work together to become more inclusive and resilient cities of the future.

In partnership with the Seoul Metropolitan Government, WeGO’s President City, WeGO successfully organized the third edition of the Seoul Smart City Prize, which continues to promote people-centered digital transformation. Beyond recognizing innovation, the Prize provides winning cities with pre-feasibility study funding to translate their ideas into real-world solutions. The Winners Training Program further enhances this effort through a four-week learning experience in Seoul, equipping participants with practical insights on smart city strategies and governance.

WeGO also launched the second year of the Seoul Smart Life Week in partnership with Seoul Metropolitan Government and AI foundation, themed AI theme for Inclusion. Smart Life Week connects people with technology and cities with companies, serving as a stage for sustainable global cooperation. This year, participation will expand to more than 200 cities and institutions and about 300 companies.

Building on the success of the Champions Program, WeGO introduced the Global Youth Award in 2025 to recognize young innovators driving smart, inclusive, and sustainable urban development. This initiative establishes a global platform to celebrate youth leadership and encourage their active engagement in smart city innovation.

The 2025 WeGO Executive Committee Meeting (EXCOM), hosted for the first time in the MENA region by Abu Dhabi, was another major achievement. Over 100 participants from member cities, partners, and stakeholders gathered to discuss WeGO’s key priorities and strengthen cross-regional collaboration.

Looking ahead to 2026, WeGO will continue to expand the Sustainable Smart City Champions Program, advance the Global Youth Award, and broaden its engagement in North America and Europe to strengthen international cooperation and inclusion.

WeGO remains steadfast in its mission to accelerate innovation, scale successful initiatives, and support cities in tackling emerging challenges. WeGO extends its deepest appreciation to the Seoul Metropolitan Government, Executive Committee members, Regional Offices, and all partners whose collaboration drives our shared success.

September 30 | Seoul, South Korea

This year Seoul Smart City Prize Ceremony took place as part of the inaugural Smart Life Week, co-hosted by the World Smart Sustainable Cities Organization (WeGO) and its President city, the Seoul Metropolitan Government. The three-day SLW event attracted more than 60,000 participants from 130 cities and institutes and 330 companies, all gathering under this year's theme of "AI for Humanity: Smart Cities Leading Tomorrow." With 220 applications, the Seoul Smart City Prize launched confidently into the forays of smart city development to contribute to the unified vision of smart cities for everyone. Each of three Prize categories, Tech-Innovacity, Human-centricity, and Leadership, gathered movers and shakers implementing commendable human-centric initiatives in equitable digitalisation and cutting edge technology innovations. The main body of operation for providing insight and direction of the Seoul Smart City Prize is the Organizing Committee. These representatives also pertain to the smart city sector giving professional consultation and recommending suitable candidates for the Evaluation Committee. The Organizing Committee also serves to encourage the promotion of the prize and its global visibility.

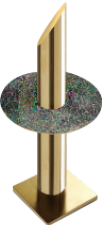
HIGHLIGHTS

- 220 submissions for the Seoul Smart City Prize and around 60,000 participants from 130 cities participated in the Smart Life Week including the Seoul Smart City Prize Ceremony.
- Around 100+ attendees composed of mayoral, vice-mayoral, and executive level representatives present during the Seoul Smart City Prize Ceremony.
- 21 cities, corporations, institutions, and individuals were awarded as winners of the Seoul Smart City Prize 2025
- Seoul Smart City Prize High Council and Steering Committee gathered together experts from the smart city area to evaluate applications including the CEO & President of SEMI, President of Descartes Institute for the Future, CEO, New York Climate Exchange, Chairman of Our Common Home & Chairman of Edgelands Institute, Director of Global Environmental Policy Program at University of Geneva, Secretary General of Metropolis, Director General of Annual Investment Meeting (AIM) Congress, President of Favors.Co, Member of Independent Oversight Advisory Committee of World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) as well as other experts from Korean and international universities working in the smart city field.



The Seoul Prize champions the people-centered digital transformation that is geared towards providing more accessible services for all citizens by recognizing cities, companies, institutions, and individuals for their efforts of digitalization that benefit even the vulnerable populations with tech-driven solutions. It also supports and engages the global community in shaping the future direction of digitalization by offering a space for discussion while fostering interaction and networking opportunities among relevant stakeholders through participation in the Seoul Smart City Prize. Unlike other prizes that may focus solely on cutting-edge technology, the Seoul Smart City Prize emphasizes digital inclusion and the human-centric approach. It recognizes efforts to bridge the digital divide and ensure that technological advancements benefit all citizens, including the disabled, elderly, and youth.

2025 Seoul Smart City Prize Winners

The Seoul Smart City Prize's evaluation committee of smart city experts carefully selected 21 winners who clearly demonstrated distinguished and exemplary initiatives that overwhelmingly satisfied the rigorous evaluation criteria centering on the themes of innovation, transformative impact, human-centeredness, advocacy, social equity, and partnership.

Among the top honorees were the cities of Dubai and Prague, as well as the mayors of Fullerton and Cali. Out of over 220 submissions received from 52 countries and 115 cities, marking the third consecutive year with more than 200 entries, 71 were from the Americas, 66 from Asia, 10 from Africa, 2 from Oceania, 26 from Europe, and 45 from the Middle East. A total of 32 semi-finalists were invited to attend the Seoul Smart City Prize Ceremony. WeGO acknowledged winning cities, corporations, institutions, and individuals across several categories for their exceptional contributions to smart urban development. 2025 WeGO Training Program for the Seoul Smart City Prize Winners

September - October | Seoul, South Korea



The 2025 WeGO Training Program for the Seoul Smart City Prize Winners was held from September 29 to October 2, 2025, in Seoul, Republic of Korea. Organized by WeGO (World Smart Sustainable Cities Organization), the program provided city officials, corporations, and institutions with practical insights, skill-building opportunities, and valuable networking experiences in the field of smart city development.

The offline program featured in-depth discussions among participating cities and included guided tours of Seoul's leading smart city projects, offering first-hand exposure to innovative and sustainable urban solutions. Participants presented their cities' Action Plans, showcasing smart city initiatives and received expert feedback on implementation and execution strategies.

Through active knowledge exchange and collaboration, the 2025 WeGO Training Program strengthened global cooperation and promoted sustainable and inclusive urban development worldwide.

WeGO Seoul Smart City International Cooperation Program - Feasibility Study & Project Implementation

October | Seoul, South Korea



The Seoul Smart City International Cooperation Program 2024—one of the key follow-up initiatives offered as a benefit to winners of the Seoul Smart City Prize, a flagship initiative jointly launched by the the World Smart Sustainable Cities Organization (WeGO) and its president city, the Seoul Metropolitan Government—has successfully concluded its 2024 project cycle with the City of São Paulo.

Jointly implemented by WeGO, Seoul Metropolitan Government, and the Seoul Urban Solutions Agency (SUSA), the program serves as a tangible reward for Seoul Smart City Prize winners, enabling them to further develop and scale their award-winning concepts through pre-feasibility studies, pilot projects, and long-term sustainability planning.

The 2024-cycle of the program supported São Paulo in enhancing its Accessible Service Network Map (ASNM)—a platform designed to improve public accessibility and inclusive urban services. The initiative delivered a comprehensive analysis, database upgrade, and a strategic roadmap to strengthen accessibility and public service delivery across the city. As a continuing legacy of the Seoul Smart City Prize, the program aims to help cities worldwide scale up innovative solutions and foster global cooperation in building smarter, more inclusive, and sustainable communities.

To mark the project's successful completion, a delegation of WeGO, the Seoul Metropolitan Government, and SUSA visited São Paulo from April 21–25, 2025, for a series of strategic meetings and a Final Dissemination Seminar, reaffirming São Paulo's strong commitment to advancing equitable and human-centric urban innovation.

WeGO Executive Committee Meeting 2025

October 29-31 | Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates

Overview

The WeGO Executive Committee (EXCOM) is an annual governance meeting of WeGO EXCOM members to review WeGO's activities, accomplishments and decide on the key directions of WeGO's future initiatives. This year, WeGO Executive Committee Meeting 2025 was hosted by one of WeGO's honorable members, Abu Dhabi. with the theme of "Driving Urban Transformation through AI and Smart Mobility in the MENA Region." WeGO and Abu Dhabi welcomed WeGO members and distinguished guests with a 3-day program including Executive Committee Meeting Session, technical and cultural tour, sessions and more. The summit aligns closely with WeGO's mission and priorities while exploring the latest advancements in mobile technology and AI across the MENA region.

WeGO EXCOM Meeting 2025 | Oct 29 - 31

This year's WeGO EXCOM Meeting 2025 welcomed over 100 live participants from five regions, including Africa, Latin America, the Middle East, and Southeast Asia. A total of 68 WeGO local government members, corporate, institutional members and partners participated in the WeGO EXCOM Meeting Session both in person and online. Other than WeGO local government members, there were WeGO corporate members, Institutional partners and media that gathered for the event in Abu Dhabi.

Abu Dhabi, the vibrant capital of the United Arab Emirates, is home to over 4 million people. As well as being a crucial financial and cultural hub, the host city has a clear vision: to be a leading enabler of smart and sustainable development in the Middle East and North Africa region. This ambition is deeply embedded in the Emirate's ethos, making it an ideal setting for the WeGO Executive Committee Meeting 2025.

A WeGO member since 2010, the city further strengthened its reputation by opening the organisation's MENA Regional Office last year. Abu Dhabi's long-standing commitment to world-leading urban solutions is evidenced by its winning of the prestigious 2024 Seoul Smart City Prize for its innovative "STEAM+ Modelling & Analytics Framework" project, and being ranked 5th globally in the 2025 IMD Smart City Index.

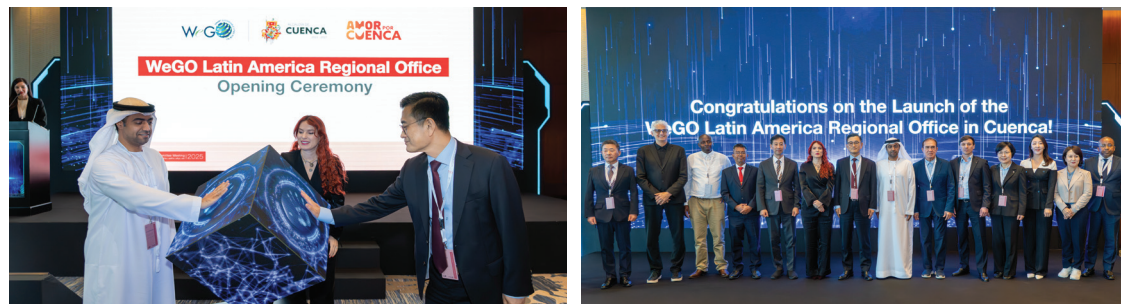
WeGO Latin America Regional Office Opening Ceremony

The symbolic opening ceremony of WeGO Latin America (Cuenca) Regional Office took place on October 30th, during the WeGO EXCOM Meeting 2025, at the Rosewood Hotel in Abu Dhabi. Distinguished guests and high-level officials included Omar Al Shaiba, Executive Director of Abu Dhabi Department of Municipalities and Transport, and Gabriela Brito, Deputy Mayor of Cuenca.

The Deputy Mayor of Cuenca reaffirmed Cuenca's dedication to fostering collaboration and innovation among Latin American cities. In addition, esteemed attendees such as the Ms. Junghwa Lee (Deputy Mayor of Goyang), H.E. Idálio D'Aguiar Juvane (Deputy Mayor of Maputo), Hon. Pablo C. Ortega (City Vice Mayor of San Fernando, La Union), and H.E. Dato' Hj Baderul Amin Abdul Hamid (Mayor of Seberang Perai) were present to celebrate together the ceremony. The ceremony concluded with a launch video and commemorative group photos, symbolizing the beginning of a new chapter in WeGO's efforts to strengthen local capacity and promote digital transformation throughout Latin America.

The Latin America Regional Office will serve as a hub for collaboration, knowledge sharing, and capacity-building initiatives aimed at empowering cities in the region to harness the benefits of smart technologies for sustainable urban development.



Mayoral Roundtable | Advancing Smart Cities through Regional Collaboration

Abu-Dhabi, United Arab Emirates | Oct 30

On Thursday, 30 October 2025, during the WeGO Executive Committee Meeting event, WeGO and hosted a Mayoral Roundtable on "Advancing Smart Cities through Regional Collaboration". This high-level discussion highlighted how regional partnerships are accelerating smart city progress by fostering knowledge sharing, coordinated digital efforts, and innovative solutions to shared urban challenges.

The discussion centered on three key themes: AI Utilization, Cities of the Future, and Regional Collaboration. First, Ms Gabriela Brito, Deputy Mayor of Cuenca presented insights on leveraging AI for public governance, while Ms. Junghwa Lee, Deputy Mayor of Goyang shared her city's approach to cultivating AI literacy in a rapidly digitalizing world. On the topic of future cities, His Excellency Dato' Hj Baderul Amin Abdul Hamid, Mayor of Seberang Perai emphasized the importance of prioritizing liveability in urban planning. Finally, His Excellency Idálio D'Aguiar Juvane, Deputy Mayor of Maputo discussed how cross-regional cooperation can mobilize resources to build resilient municipal infrastructure and services.

By bringing together diverse perspectives, the session reinforced the power of collaborative action in creating smarter, more sustainable urban environments.



WeGO Smart Sustainable City Index : Cities Future Readiness Index

November | Geneva, Switzerland



WeGO launched a Cities Future Readiness Index in partnership with the "Descartes Institute" and "United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE)-University of Geneva (UNIGE) Center of Excellence for Smart Sustainable Cities", providing a comprehensive tool for cities to prepare for the future. 102 cities were studied in the index, including 41 WeGO members.

The index was unveiled at a hybrid launch ceremony at the Palais des Nations, UN Headquarters in Geneva, on November 18. The most future-ready city of this year was London, followed by San Francisco, Boston, Paris, and New York. Seoul was ranked in 10th place.

The new CFRI was created in line with WeGO's missions, designed to prioritize human-centric innovation within the context of urban digital transformation. Developed by a globally recognized team, the CFRI distinguishes itself from other city assessment indices through its innovative, dual-structure approach.

In line with the partnership on the index and the Seoul Smart City Prize, a city was selected to be awarded a Special Mention for the Seoul Smart City Prize 2025, for which the ceremony was held in September in Seoul.

Strengthening Global Partnership: Institutions & Associations Engagement

Year-round

Throughout the year, WeGO significantly expanded its global network by actively engaging with a wide range of institutions and associations both on and offline. This year, WeGO had more than 90 meetings with institutions, associations, and international organizations.

Building upon existing collaborations with partners such as ITU and UN-Habitat, WeGO intensified its engagement with major international organizations. High-level meetings were conducted with key figures, including the UN Under-Secretary-General and Special Envoy for Digital and Emerging Technologies (UN ODET), UN Under-Secretary-General for Policy in the Executive Office of the Secretary-General (EOSG), UN Assistant Secretaries-General, the Head of UNDRR, and the Executive Secretary of UN ESCAP. These discussions have facilitated new partnerships with numerous UN entities, including UN ODET, UNDP, UNECE, and the WMO.



Strengthening city-to-city cooperation was also a key focus. WeGO engaged in discussions with partners such as the Global Cities Hub (GCH), the National League of Cities (NLC), Metropolis, and OASC to enhance inter-city network collaboration.

WeGO also broadened its alliances across industry, academia, and research. The organization strengthened ties with industrial partners like SEMI and advanced its relationship with the Silk-Road University Network.

Furthermore, WeGO established and deepened connections with leading research institutes, including the East-West Center, CSIS, and the International Climate Development Institute. This has also led to new, high-impact projects, such as a Smart City Index with the Descartes Institute and joint work with the UNECE-University of Geneva Center of Excellence.

Through these strategic partnerships, WeGO is solidifying its position as a hub for smart and sustainable cities. These alliances are critical for co-creating innovative solutions, disseminating best practices, and connecting WeGO members with the knowledge and resources to create better urban futures.

WeGO Sustainable Smart City Champions

WEGO SUSTAINABLE SMART CITY

All year round | Geneva, Athens, Kuala Lumpur, New York, Milan, Brescia, Seoul



Marking its fourth year, the World Smart Sustainable Cities Organization (WeGO) has expanded its youth capacity-building program, WeGO Sustainable Smart City Champions (or 'WeGO Champions'). 'WeGO Champions' is an initiative open to students and young leaders worldwide, aimed at enhancing their skills in the field of smart city development.

Building on the success of previous editions—which attracted over 600 participants in 2024—the 2025 program introduces a hybrid learning experience that combines cutting-edge online lectures with dynamic in-person workshops in leading cities across the globe. This year's focus, "AI for Smart and Sustainable Cities," highlights the transformative role of artificial intelligence in advancing urban innovation and sustainability.

To complement the online modules, WeGO has been hosting seven in-person workshops throughout 2025 in leading smart and sustainable cities, including Geneva, Athens, Kuala Lumpur, New York, Milan, Brescia, and Seoul.

As an extension of the Champions Program, WeGO launched the Global Youth Award 2025, celebrating exceptional young leaders advancing innovation in smart cities, digital transformation, and sustainable urban solutions.

In this context, as part of Seoul Smart Life Week 2025, WeGO hosted the Sustainable Smart City Champions Session at COEX, bringing together Global Youth Award winners, international experts, and city leaders for an engaging dialogue under the theme "Youth x Experts: A Dialogue on Smart Cities."

With over 90 participants in attendance, the session featured a dynamic panel discussion where award winners posed thought-provoking questions to experts on AI, housing, digital equity, climate resilience, and data ethics. The event also marked the inaugural Global Youth Award Ceremony, honoring 16 outstanding winners across seven categories: Smart City, Net Zero, Advanced Technology, Leadership, Youth Entrepreneurship, SDGs, and Culture.

The Award was developed in partnership with leading institutions, including the University of Geneva, Catholic University of Milan, WIPO, Next Challenge Foundation, Silk Road University Network, Kookmin University, SUNY Korea, and 3K Software / All Nations Global Emerging Leadership School.

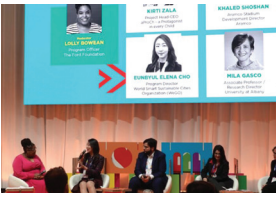
Mayors Forum (July 2-4, 2025 | Vienna, Austria)

Throughout the year, WeGO engaged extensively with representatives from both institutional and private sector organizations, introducing its services and programs while identifying new opportunities for collaboration. WeGO successfully conducted over 20 meetings with private sectors, including corporations, media, and chamber of commerce. These interactions resulted in the development of strong partnerships with a diverse range of stakeholders across the smart city sector, significantly expanding WeGO's network and solidifying connections with leading technology providers in Korea and internationally.

As a direct outcome of these efforts, WeGO successfully onboarded two prestigious corporate members—K-Coop and LG Electronics— and four institution members—Asociación de Municipalidades Ecuatorianas (AME), Busan Economic Promotion Agency (BEPA), Paris Est Marne & Bois, University of the Commonwealth Caribbean (UCC)— further enhancing its capacity to identify and integrate innovative technologies and smart solutions in the evolving landscape of smart city development. This strategic engagement will facilitate the continued advancement of sustainable and inclusive urban solutions on a global scale.

WeGO actively engaged in numerous international networking events fostering global partnerships, including the international career fair and KGGTF K-Partnership Connect. WeGO utilized these platforms to meet new partners, engage with the public, and further strengthen its presence.



Meetings with Diplomatic Corps

In line with WeGO's mission to promote the global transformation of cities into smart and sustainable urban ecosystems, the Secretariat maintains active and strategic cooperation with the diplomatic corps and other foreign delegations based in the Republic of Korea. Embassies play a key role as main intermediaries in facilitating international collaboration, enabling WeGO to connect more effectively with local governments, metropolitan authorities, and key institutions around the world.

Throughout recent years, WeGO has successfully leveraged embassy channels to establish and expand cooperation with cities across the Middle East and North Africa (MENA), Europe, and Asia. These diplomatic linkages have proven essential in opening doors to new municipal partners, organizing bilateral meetings, and identifying strategic opportunities for future collaboration.

2025 Activities

Mission trip to United States

January - February, 2025

WeGO carried out strategic missions to United States in early 2025, participating in CES, the SEMI Industry Strategy Symposium, and the U.S. Conference of Mayors to promote the Seoul Smart City Prize and strengthen partnerships with key organizations including the CTA, SEMI, and the National League of Cities. The delegation also held high-level meetings with UN officials to expand cooperation in sustainable development, digital technology, and AI. In addition, new collaborations were formed with The New York Climate Exchange and The Korea Society, both joining the Seoul Prize High Council and exploring joint initiatives to enhance WeGO's global engagement.



Advisory Kick-Off Event

March 31, 2025

WeGO successfully held the 2025 Advisory Board Kick-Off Event, gathering key experts from government, academia, the private sector, and international organizations based in Korea to discuss strategies for advancing global smart city cooperation. The meeting marked the board's first official gathering and introduced WeGO's 2025 agenda, emphasizing inclusive and human-centered smart city growth. Members shared insights on city branding, integrating small and medium-sized cities into the global network, and balancing smart city innovation with carbon neutrality goals.



Diplomatic Kick-Off Event

March 07, 2025

WeGO hosted a diplomatic event bringing together over 30 ambassadors and diplomats to present its 2025 agenda and strengthen global partnerships for smart city development. Ambassadors from countries including Kazakhstan, Thailand, Egypt, and the UAE commended WeGO's leadership in regional cooperation and highlighted ongoing projects in collaboration with the Secretariat. Representatives from more than 15 other nations joined the discussion, emphasizing the value of cross-border collaboration for human-centric innovation. Under the theme "Smart Life in Smart City," WeGO showcased its 2025 vision focused on digital transformation and AI, while also introducing the Third Seoul Smart City Prize.



Seoul Smart City International Cooperation Program Final Dissemination Seminar

April 21 - 25, 2024

WeGO, in partnership with the Seoul Metropolitan Government and the Seoul Urban Solutions Agency (SUSA), participated in the Final Dissemination Seminar for the Seoul Smart City International Cooperation Program in São Paulo, concluding a pre-feasibility study on improving accessibility for persons with disabilities through the Accessible Service Network Map (ASNM). During the mission, WeGO met with key city stakeholders and organizations such as Prodam, SP Negócios, and the University of São Paulo's Innovation Center to strengthen partnerships, promote the Seoul Smart City Prize, and foster collaboration on inclusive and sustainable urban innovation.

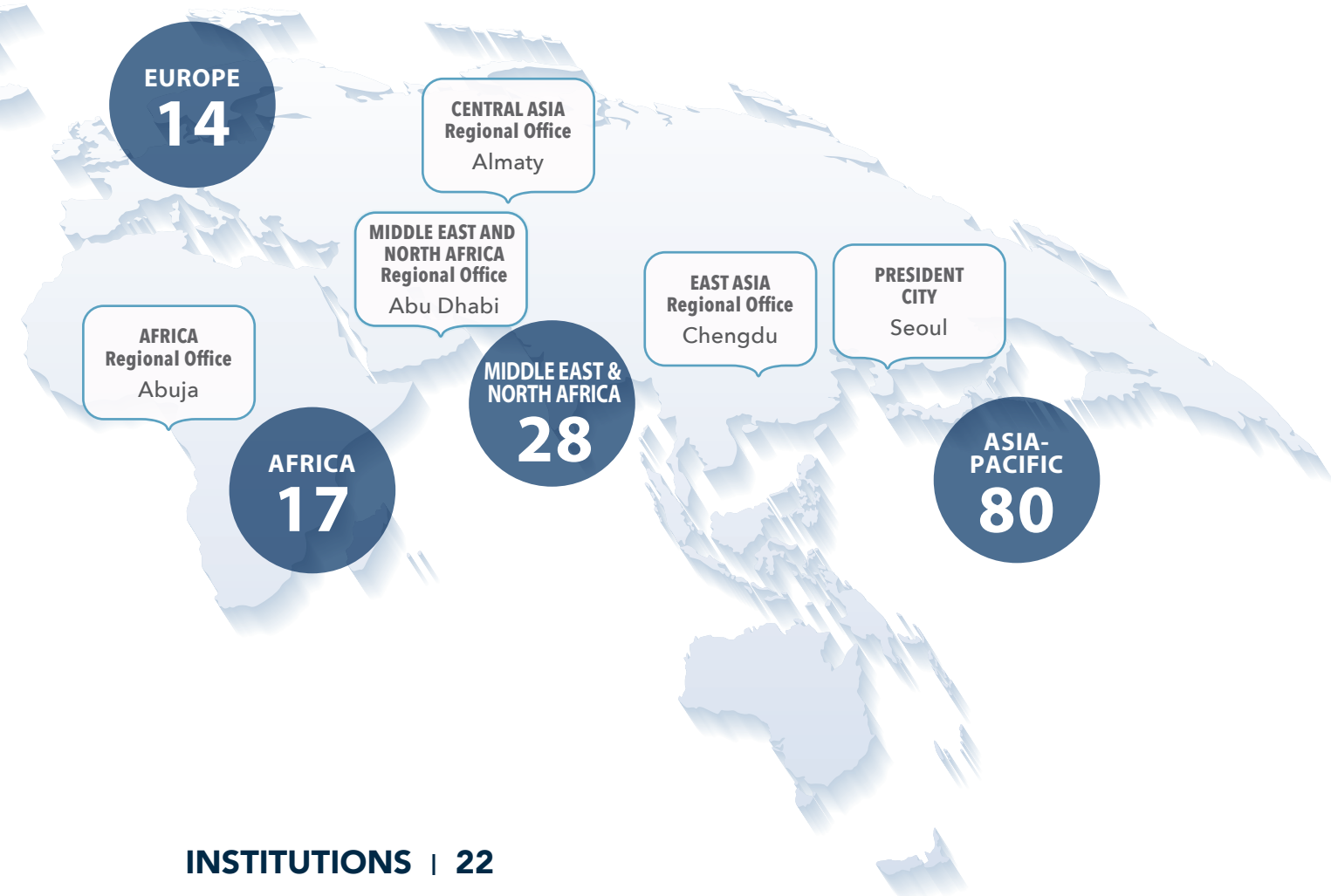
